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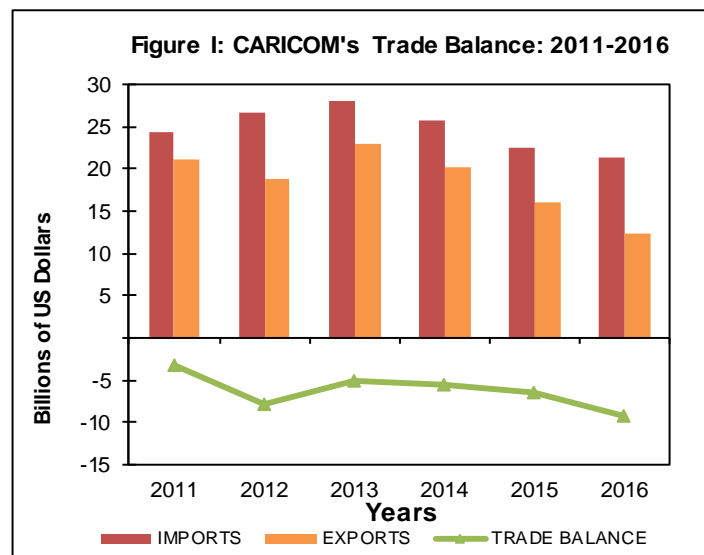
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## CARICOM's TOTAL TRADE SUMMARY BY TRADING PARTNERS: 2011 -2016

### CARICOM's TOTAL TRADE

- CARICOM's total imports declined from US\$24.4 billion in 2011 (all Member States reporting) to US\$21.5 billion (twelve Member States reporting)<sup>1</sup> in 2016.
- Similarly, CARICOM's earnings from total exports decreased from US\$21.2 billion in 2011 (twelve Member States reporting)<sup>1</sup> to US\$12.3 billion in 2016 (eleven Member States reporting)<sup>2</sup>.
- Due to the different rates of growth of its imports and exports, CARICOM recorded *trade deficits* throughout the period moving from US\$3.1 billion in 2011 to US\$9.1 billion in 2016.



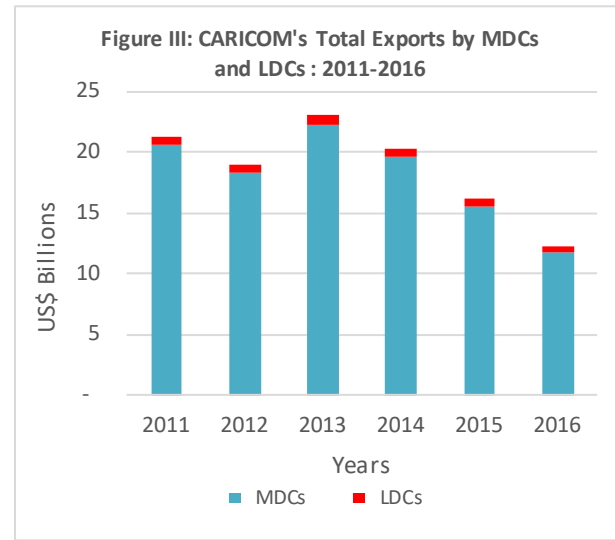
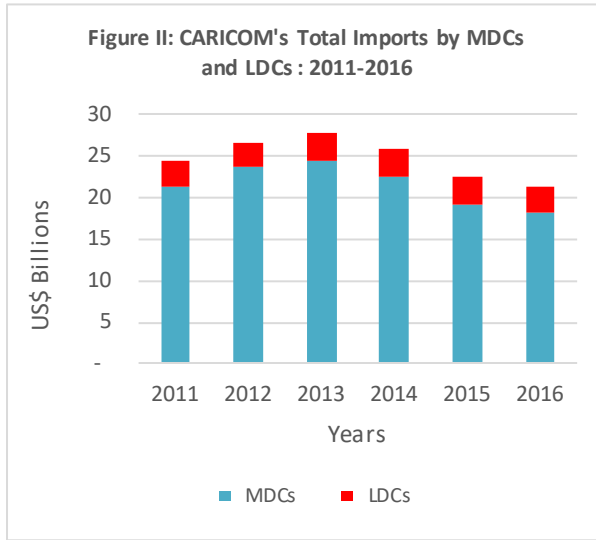
### Major Contributors

- The MDCs dominated CARICOM's total imports and accounted for an average percentage contribution of 87.1% over the period. Imports of the MDCs decreased from US\$21.4 billion in 2011 to US\$18.2 billion in 2016, which accounted for 87.6% in 2011 and 84.6% in 2016 of CARICOM's total imports.
- The LDCs contributed an average percentage contribution of 12.9% of CARICOM's total imports over the period.
- For CARICOM's exports, the MDCs also dominated with an average percentage contribution of 96.4% over the period. Exports of this group moved from US\$20.5 billion in 2011 to US\$11.8 billion in 2016, which represented 96.6% in 2011, and 95.6% in 2016 of CARICOM's total exports.

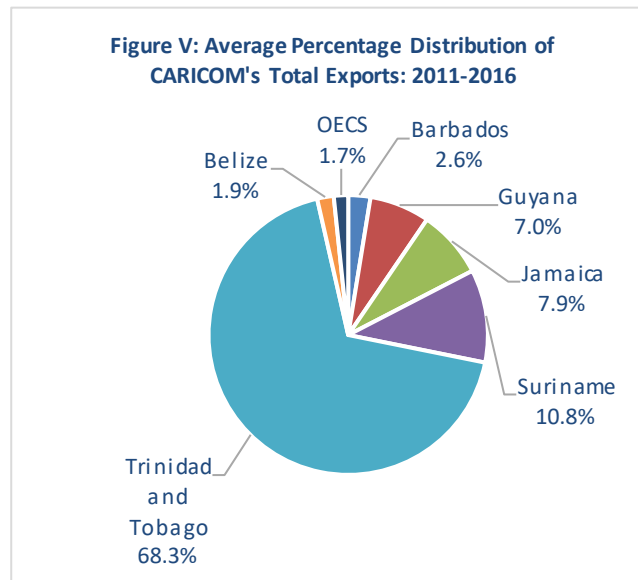
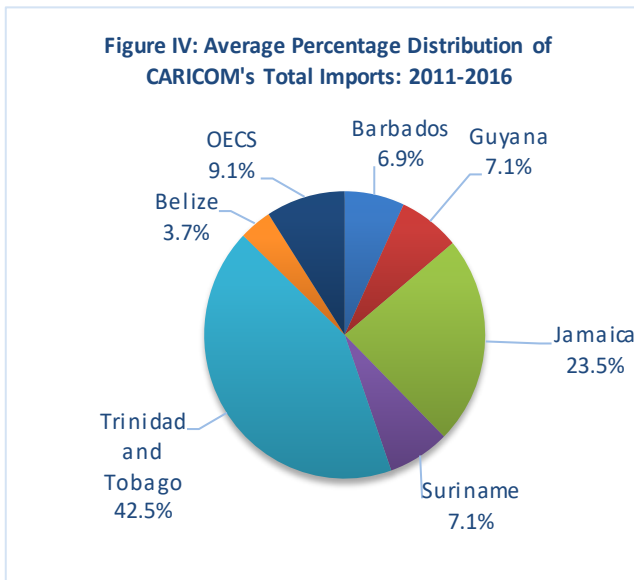

- The LDCs as such accounted for an average percentage contribution of 3.6% of CARICOM's total exports over the period.

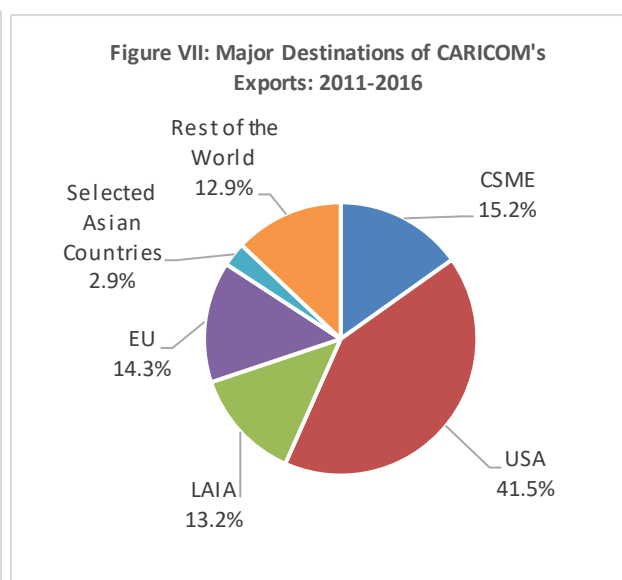
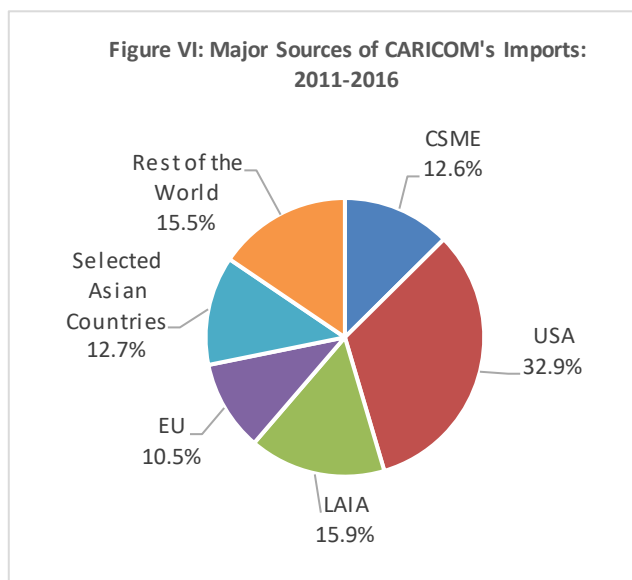


- As it relates to the performance of individual Member States, *Trinidad and Tobago* and *Jamaica* were CARICOM's top importers over the period.
- *Trinidad and Tobago* accounted for 39.2% in 2011 and 41.9% in 2016 respectively of CARICOM's total imports. *Jamaica* accounted for 27.1% in 2011 and 22.1% in 2016 respectively of CARICOM's total imports. These two Member States together accounted for an average percentage contribution of 66.1% of CARICOM's total imports over the period.
- For exports, *Trinidad and Tobago* was CARICOM's leading exporter throughout the period, with percentage contributions of 70.1% in 2011 and 59.9% in 2016. *Suriname* was the next highest exporter for the period, 2011-2015 and *Guyana* captured this position in 2016. Collectively these three Member States represented an average percentage contribution of 86.0% of CARICOM's total exports.



## Major Trading Partners

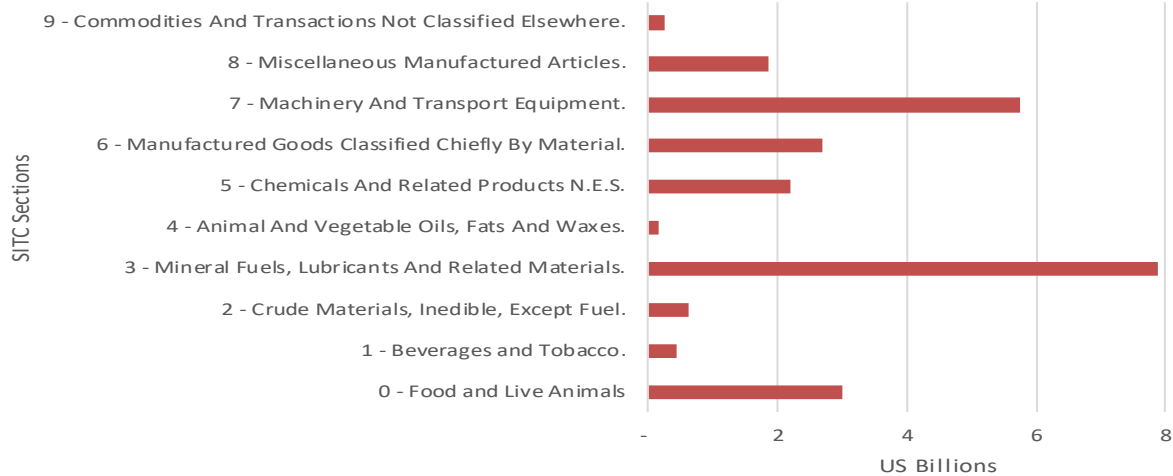
- CARICOM's major sources of imports were the *United States of America (USA)*, *Latin American Integration Association (LAIA)*, *CARICOM Single Market and Economy (CSME)* and *Selected Asian Countries*, which collectively accounted for an average percentage contribution of 69.1% of CARICOM's total imports over the period.
- For exports, the trading areas that dominated CARICOM's exports were the *United States of America (USA)*, *CARICOM Single Market and Economy (CSME)*, *the European Union (EU)* and *Latin American Integration Association (LAIA)*, which collectively accounted for an average percentage contribution of 74.6% of CARICOM's total exports over the period.



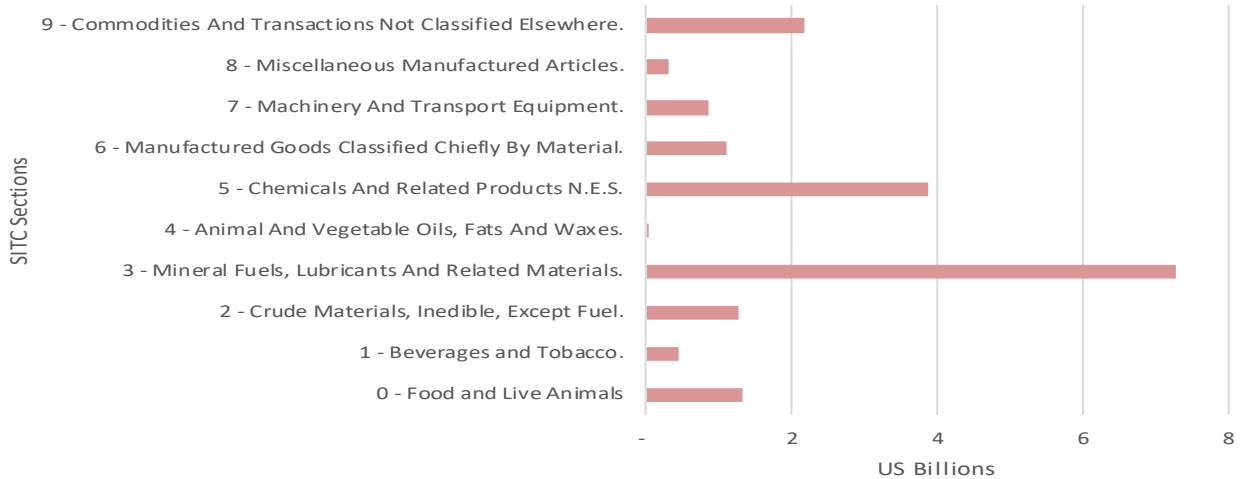
## CARICOM'S TOTAL TRADE BY SECTIONS OF THE SITC

- *Mineral fuels, Lubricants and related Materials*, and *Machinery and Transport Equipment* were CARICOM's highest imported commodity over the period. These commodities on average accounted for 31.7% and 23.2% of CARICOM's total imports over the period.
- For CARICOM's exports, *Mineral fuels, Lubricants and related Materials*, and *Chemicals and related products, n.e.s.* dominated with average percentage contributions of 39.1% and 20.8% respectively over the period.

### CARICOM's Top items traded

- For 2016, CARICOM's top five imports were:
  - *Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals, crude,*
  - *Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous minerals (other than crude); preparations, n.e.s containing by weight 70% or more of petroleum oils or oils obtained from bituminous minerals,*
  - *Motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport of persons*
  - *Ships, boats (including hovercraft) and floating structures; and*
  - *Edible products and reparations, n.e.s.*

These commodities collectively accounted for 32.8% of CARICOM's total imports from all sources.

- For 2016, CARICOM's top five domestic exports were:
  - *Inorganic chemical elements, oxides and halogen salts;*
  - *Natural gas, whether or not liquefied;*
  - *Fertilizers;*
  - *Gold, non-monetary (excluding gold ores and concentrates); and*
  - *Alcohols, phenols, phenol-alcohols, and their halogenated, sulphonated, nitrated or nitrosated derivatives,*
  
- These items accounted for a combined percentage contribution of 55.9% of CARICOM's total domestic exports to all destinations in 2016.

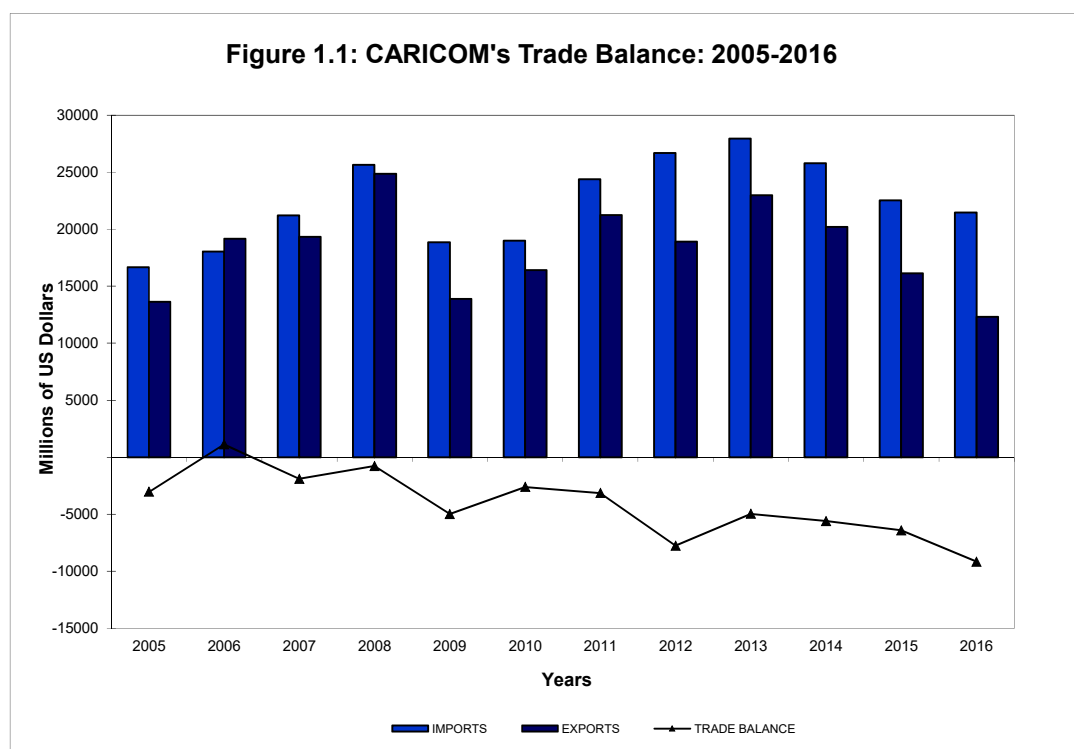

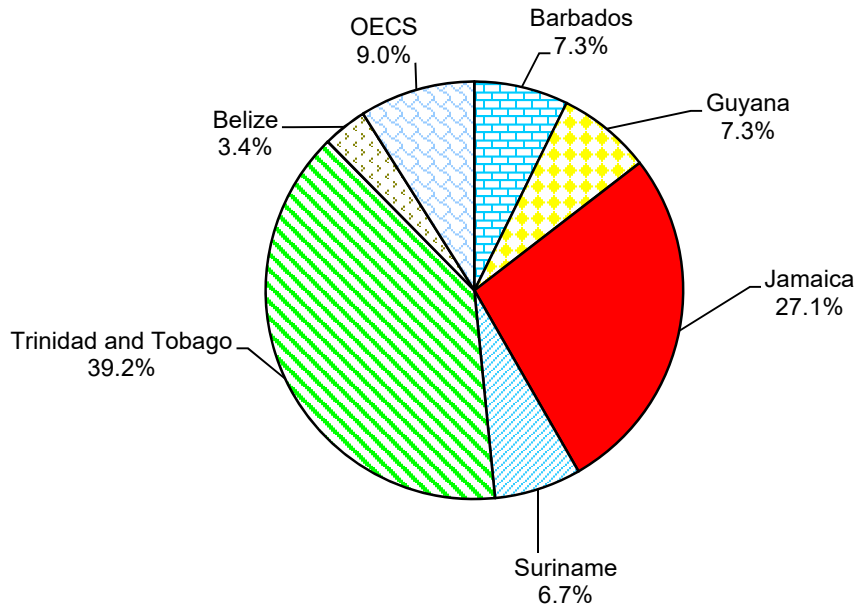

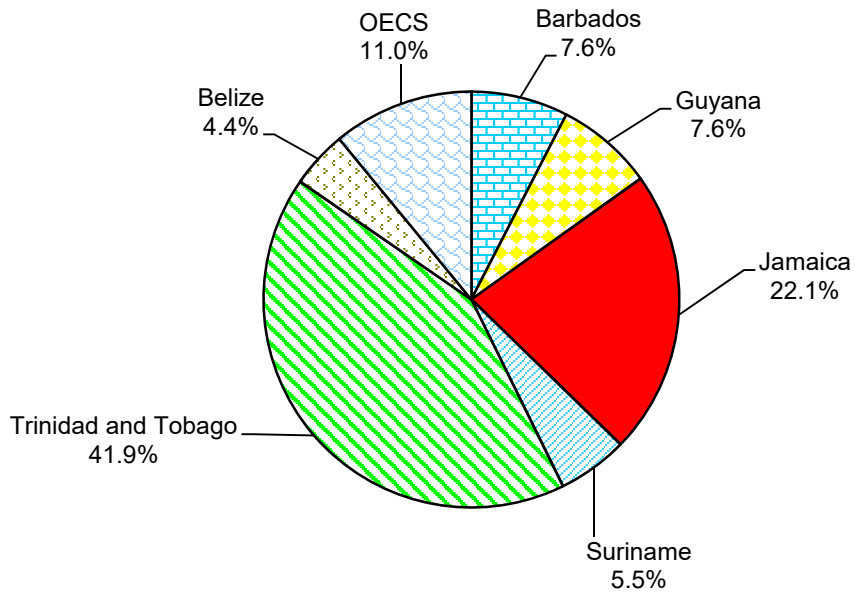

**Figure 1.3: Percentage Distribution of CARICOM's Total Imports: 2016**



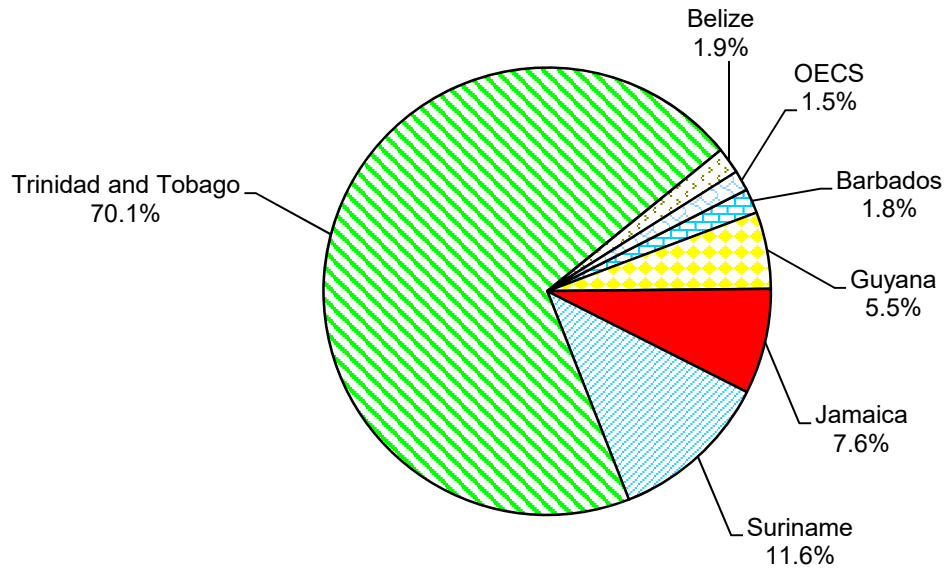

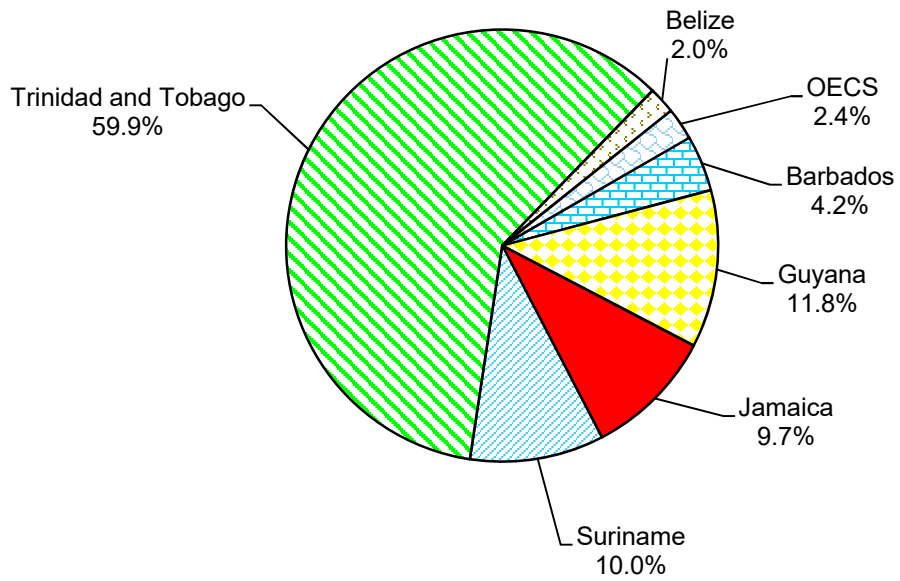
